

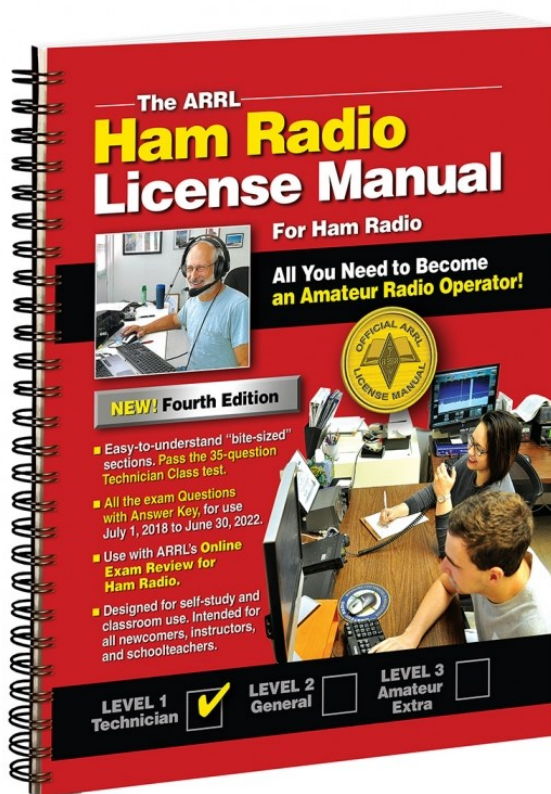
Get Your Ham Radio License

- Cost \$15
- When **Saturday Feb 9, 2019** 8:00 AM
- Where William G Long Senior Center,
223 Arnold Mill Rd, Woodstock

- No age restrictions – recommend 5th grade and up
- Only must get 26 of 35 questions right
- 98% success taking the Ham Cram method

Process:

1. Email Dave Crandall JOTA.Cherokee.GA@gmail.com indicating interest in Ham Cram
2. Study material provided by Dave via email
3. Take online practice exams
4. Go to training session Saturday morning February 9
5. Take test immediately after cram session
6. Get FCC call sign in about 5-10 days



This is not too difficult. You will be provided every possible question on the test and the correct answer several weeks prior to the test. During the Ham Cram session every question will be reviewed. The math for technician is simple but you can miss nine questions and still pass. Benefits on having your Ham Radio license are numerous. It looks good on college applications and there are many Scholarships available to Ham Radio Operators. You can talk at much farther distances than with retail bought walkie talkies for less money. You can communicate during emergencies—even send emails without internet/cell. \$35 Amateur Radio Handheld Radios “HTs” can communicate over long distances through repeaters.

Optional training material – not at all required but helpful. My 14 year old son liked the videos better than reading the manual.
